Aardehuis Festival Rules



RESPECT AND SAFETY

- Respect our residents and their privacy. The festival is located in and around a residential area.
- Repect our rich nature. Our neighborhood is carefully maintained. Stay on the paths and within the festival
 area. Do not simply walk into someone's garden. It is forbidden to pick flowers or plants.

PERMITTED ITEMS

- Hobby recording equipment such as a camera or video camera.
- Something small to eat or drink.
- Sunscreen, small umbrellas, or something to sit on.
- Strollers or other means of transport for small children.

PROHIBITED ITEMS

- Alcoholic beverages, hard drugs, soft drugs in larger quantities than legally tolerated.
- (Fire)arms and other dangerous objects such as sharp knives.
- Pets are unfortunately not allowed to best preserve the peace in the neighborhood and for our animals.
- Cars, fatbikes, scooters, or motorcycles.

REGISTRATION AND ADMISSION

• Entering the event premises is at your own risk. The organization itself or employees and volunteers working for or on behalf of the organization cannot be held responsible for any injury and/or damage to objects and/or in the event of intangible damage caused during the event.

GEDRAGSREGELS

- We open our neighborhood to people who come to enjoy music, being together, and fun. Enjoy with respect for the environment.
- Threats, vandalism, damage, assault, intimidation, aggression, discrimination, racism, and unwanted harassment are absolutely not tolerated.
- The organization may refuse entry to individuals exhibiting strange or violent behavior or remove visitors from the event premises.

- Smoking: Our festival is smoke-free. There will be a special smoking zone for visitors who wish to smoke.
